It has been a wonderful year so far with so many achievements and opportunities. In reflecting on the past four months, we have much to be thankful for and excited about. During the season of Advent, we had many opportunities to pray, serve and grow closer to God. We participated in weekly prayer services led by our students where they learned about the Season of Advent, the baby Jesus and the Christmas season. We have begun our next round of testing with MAP. Grades K2 through grade 8 will be testing one hour a week for the next three weeks. In September, we tested to create a

baseline to recognize areas of growth and need. And have been using the results to focus our lesson planning. Please make sure your child has breakfast and is on time to school. This will help them settle into the day and feel successful. We have also asked your child to take his/her time on the testing. Students may have a break if they need it. This testing data allows teachers to plan lessons that meet the needs of all students.

Our Christmas Shows were fantastic!! It was a major task to pull off these shows virtually. I cannot praise and thank our Fine Arts teachers enough for what they do for our students. They certainly want our children to share their gifts and talents. This was especially true this year with COVID restrictions!! Our school administrators and staff worked around these restrictions to give each child and family a special memory and experience.


Lower Mills News

We had so much fun making them and using them in class! We talked about how the red and white colored beads look similar to the ten frames we are used to using, except they are side by side instead of on top and bottom. With our number racks, we were able to solve tricky math questions that were hard for us to understand before. We can't wait to keep working on our math skills!



4B has been working on enriching their Catholic identity through practicing their faith in creative ways! We learned about the Feast of the Immaculate Conception through discussion about our Catholic mission and the meaning of faith. To celebrate the feast, we each wrote a personal note to Mary thanking her for all she has done and asking her to answer our prayers for ourselves and others. Columbia News

In K2 we have been using popsicle sticks to make tally marks and help us group and count. Students practiced adding and subtracting sticks to determine the new sum. 5 tally marks are special because it looks like a "gate!" In Wonders, the class listened to the story "Clang! Clang! Beep! Beep! Listen to the City" where our essential question was "What are the different sounds we hear?" Students worked on exploring the different sounds we hear through listening for key details. Students also got to work making our letter of the week which was "Nn."



Grade 3 has been honoring various cultures all school year. Beginning in September, students have been watching Daily Mass every Friday in a variety of languages including: English, Spanish, Latin, and Italian. In October, students spent part of their Religion classes learning about the Mexican holiday of Dia de Muertos. Students studied the holidav. about the learned traditions and then helped facilitate the creation of an ofrenda (altar) to celebrate the holiday. Finally, with the new Reading program, Wonders, the students were tasked with creating their own paper quilt square that represented the cultures that make them unique. Once their squares were completed a quilt was "stitched" together on the wall in the hallway to display what makes grade 3 so special.

Grade 2 students took a field trip to the Museum of Science and spent the day exploring the many exhibits the museum has to offer. Students experienced the arctic, got up close and personal with bones and fossils, and explored engineering and balance using their own bodies. The highlight of their special trip was attending the temporary exhibit, All Aboard! Students learned about trains and tracks and enjoyed a 4D viewing of The Polar Express - students felt like they were passengers aboard the train and even felt snow!

Students celebrated Computer Science Education Week, held the week of December 6th. SJP Neponset parent, Kunjal Desai, visited our campus from Accenture Technology, and held interactive workshops for our students. Students learned about computer science through Mr. Desai's handson presentation. They then explored the basics of coding by programming some computer games!
